HISTORY OF CAP

Civil Air Patrol was formed on Dec. 1st, 1941, with Major General John F. Curry serving as the first National Commander.

During WWII, CAP members spotted 173 German submarines, sank 2 of them, and flew over 85,000 missions over coastal waters.

In 1943, CAP was placed under the jurisdiction of the Army Air Forces and in 1948 was permanently established as the Auxiliary of the new U.S. Air Force.

- Date CAP was founded: Dec. 1, 1941
- Date USAF was founded: July 26, 1947

Pro Words:

This is – To establish communication
Roger – Transmission received satisfactory
Wilco – Last transmission received, will comply
Say Again – Repeat last transmission
Read Back – So transmitting officer knows message was received correctly.
Standby – Pause for a few moments
Over – Done transmitting, expect reply
Out – Done transmitting, do NOT expect reply

Always write information down.
